SENIOR DOGS AT MOSTLY MUTTS FETCH GRANT

Kennesaw, GA –Old dogs have something to wag about this summer, as The Grey Muzzle Organization announces the recipients of its annual grants, and dogs at Mostly Mutts Animal Rescue & Adoption are among the winners.

Mostly Mutts Animal Rescue & Adoption in Kennesaw, GA is one of 77 animal welfare groups chosen from 266 applicants to receive a grant to help local senior dogs. The winning groups received more than \$616,000 in grants to help save or improve the lives of at-risk old dogs in their communities.

“This grant will help us give senior dogs the veterinary and dental care needed to be ready to go to their forever homes,” said Tammy Turley of Mostly Mutts. “No one is more grateful than an old dog, and we’re looking forward to helping more senior dogs get the second chance they all deserve.”

Over the past 13 years, the national nonprofit, Grey Muzzle Organization has provided more than \$3.1 million in grants to support its vision of “a world where no old dog dies alone and afraid.”

“Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we’re delighted to help deserving organizations like Mostly Mutts Animal Rescue & Adoption make a difference in the lives of dogs and people in their communities,” Grey Muzzle’s Executive Director Lisa Lunghofer said. “Many senior dogs in the Atlanta area are enjoying their golden years in loving homes thanks to the wonderful work of Mostly Mutts.”

Since 2004, Mostly Mutts Animal Rescue has been working to reduce the number of animals euthanized at local shelters in metro Atlanta. We work closely with animal control officers to save adoptable dogs that are often moments away from being put to sleep. Often, these dogs are sick and injured and require rehabilitation.
